

#### Blue Mountains Cultural Centre Exhibition Programme Preview

A number of members attended the packed evening on Friday 30th March

Director Paul Brinkman spoke about the direction the centre will take. "the Cultural centre will provide unprecedented exposure for local artists".

Exhibition manager Sarah Gurich explained how the 600 square metre gallery area will work. Able to be divided into three spaces featuring about 20 exhibitions each year.

The upcoming programme for the opening in November and for the next year were outined. Planning for major exhibitions needs to be done three years in advance. Many of the ones we travel to see will be available locally.

Particular interest was shown in the Expose Program open to Blue Mountain artists. An exciting initiative giving local artists the opportunity to apply to have their works exhibited in the gallery. Full details will be available on the Cultural centre's website from August with initial call-out for applications in November.

Tim Smith gave an overview of the Insight Membership Program which includes special benefits for local artists such as professional development seminars, master classes and social events, tours etc.

We will have locally all the type of activities that you get from the NSWAG without travelling to Sydney.

It's a pity that some of the long term critics of this development were not there to see and hear the exciting and excellent programs being planned.

#### A good day out-exhibitions

Three interesting exhibitions on now within easy walking distance of each other in Sydney and with a linked theme. Highly recommended is *Lewin –Wild Art* now showing at the State Library of NSW in Macquarie Street. This comprehensive show is the first featuring the work of Australia's first professional and non convict artist. John William Lewin was an illustrator who came to Australia in 1800 and for the next nineteen years documented many of the native plants, animals and birds. Unlike other artists of the time and indeed many of his contemporaries, Lewin used fresh or live subject material and for the first time produced familiar representations of our fauna and flora instead of the often comical pictures drawn from preserved and dried skins as was usually the case. Of particular interest to Mountain residents are the drawings and paintings of the early explorers journeys through the mountains to the west. This is a big exhibition and includes work and documents by others but well worth the time and effort.

Across the Domain in the Royal Botanic Gardens there are two other exhibitions which make an interesting link and comparison with the Lewin show. 'The Masters and Moore' is a stunning exhibition by many of Australia's foremost contemporary botanical artists in the Maiden Theatre and Moore room. There are some 160 framed works [plus unframed and prints] from 86 artists with something to suit all tastes. Bearing in mind the superior quality and range of materials available to the artists of Botanica 2012, the work of Lewin some 200 years earlier seems even more remarkable.

Nearby, the Red Box gallery, adjacent to the Herbarium, is yet another contrast with a small exhibition of black and white scientific drawings of plants submitted for the *Margaret Flockton Award*. While all are of a very high standard the two works in graphite by a Brazilian illustrator stood out for me in the way they captured an almost photographic quality linking these very detailed drawings with the more contemporary exhibits in Botanica

NOTE ;Botanica finishes on the 22 April so try and get to see them all before that date.
