What is the regulation regarding duty for what is really 3 separate exhibitions, Spring, 9x5, Leura Garden Festival & plein air? Duty is required As usual

Can I enter only one section? Yes

Basically deliver your 9"x5"paintings and the Exhibition Committee will take care of everything else.

- -Bring your own work(s) to be photographed;
- -Bring a statement/bio about yourself of no more than 300 words;
- -Sign the Artists Waiver;
- -Pay the Gallery fee of \$20 if joining the Gallery for the first time, or \$10 if renewing.



We will do the rest which includes taking the images of your work and uploading them to the gallery. It is easy and gives you the opportunity to display your work in our online gallery.

In order to exhibit, members are required to assist in manning the Exhibition. PLEASE INDICATE PREFERRED DUTY DAYS ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF THE ENTRY FORM. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to obtain a substitute if unable to attend at the nominated time.

Please turn over to read the Artwork Conditions

- → Open to Financial SMA members only
- → Maximum number of paintings:

Five (5) at up to 380cm (150") MAXIMUM OUTSIDE DIMENSIONS

- → Artworks must be presented to a high standard:
 - For FRAMED works: Ready to hang, preferably with taut cord or wire and strong staples or "D" rings
 - For STRETCHED UNFRAMED CANVASSES: No visible staples on sides, with all edges painted; also ready to hang with taut cord or wire and strong staples or "D" rings.
 - -All works: No screw eyes or protrusions that could damage other Artworks. "D" rings and wire ends to be taped.
 - NO WET PAINTINGS
- → NO INFRINGEMENT OF COPYRIGHT (eg other artists' work, photographs from calendars, Readers Digest and Australiana books etc.)
- → Works must have been completed within the last two years
- → Works must not have been displayed in previous SMA exhibition
- → All works must be for sale; prices not negotiable.
- → Works delivered MUST be as per Entry Form. NO SUBSTITUTIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED
- → THE ARTISTS NAME AND THE TITLE, PRICE AND MEDIUM MUST BE CLEARLY DISPLAYED ON THE BACKOF THE ARTWORK, AND MUST AGREE WITH INFORMATION ON THE ENTRY FORM, INCLUDING SECTION.
