
The cost is \$45.00 per person, BYO - no corkage. CASH ONLY. Please pay the treasurer at the meeting or cash on the day.



The alternative Archibald and Wynne Prize selection 12 May – 29 July 2018 The Salon des Refusés was initiated by the S.H. Ervin Gallery in 1992 in response to the large number of works entered into the Archibald Prize which were not selected for display in the official exhibition. The Archibald Prize is one of Australia's most high profile and respected awards which attracts hundreds of entries each year and the S.H. Ervin Gallery's 'alternative' selection has become a much anticipated feature of the Sydney scene. Each year our panel is invited to go behind the scenes of the judging process for the annual Archibald Prize for portraiture and Wynne Prize for landscape painting and figure sculpture at the Art Gallery of New South Wales, to select an exhibition from the many hundreds of works entered in both prizes but not chosen for the official award exhibition.

ARTWORK CONDITIONS SPRING 2018 JUDGED EXHIBITION Issued 16.06.2018

 Artworks must be of a high standard and must be ready to hang with taut cord or wire and strong staples or "D" rings.

Screws, "D" rings and wire ends must be covered with tape to prevent damage to other artworks.

- No wet paintings accepted.
- Position of string or wire should be 1/3rd from top of frame.
- Works must have been completed within the last two years.
- Works must not have been displayed in any previous SMA exhibition.
- Artists name and the title, price and medium must be clearly displayed on the back of the artwork, including <u>Section</u>, and must agree with information on the Entry form.
- <u>Unframed stretched canvasses</u> must have no visible staples. All edges must be painted and ready to hang.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ARTWORKS: MAXIMUM SIZE: Small paintings Other

5 works per artist Up to 127cm (50") outside dimensions Up to 380cm (150") outside dimensions
